Membership fees As our only source of income, membership fees loom large in a treasurer's life. As you know your current membership will be rolled forward until the end of 2020. If we had not had the Coronavirus crisis the fee from August would have been £43. The savings because of the virus and our reserves will be used to cover some of the costs until December. We are hoping to resume normal operations in full by the start of 2021 and in December there will be a fee for membership until August 2021. When it is clearer what our costs will be, we will be able to decide what the reduced membership fee will be. New members are being charged a small fee until December when they will also pay the fee until August.
