The speaker for our meeting on **Wednesday**, **12th April** will be Pete Lemon from the Blue Lamp Trust Bobby Scheme. This is a local charitable trust based at the Police and Fire Headquarters in Eastleigh. It works in partnership with Hampshire & Isle of Wight Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Service to provide free security and fire safety checks of vulnerable people's properties. These checks are conducted by a team of uniformed, trained and police-vetted fitters. Services include the fitting of door chains, additional door and window locks, spy holes, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, as well as advice on fire safety, scams and cold callers.
